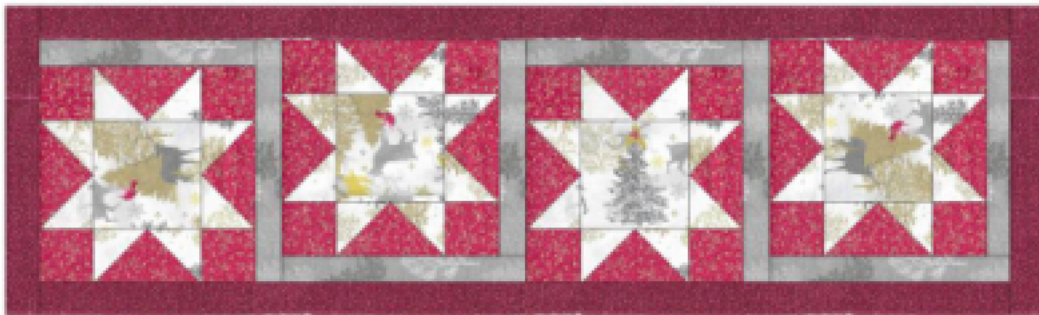


A Fat Quarter Friendly Christmas Runner

Fabric Requirements

5 Fat Quarters
 Binding ¼ yard
 Backing ½ yard

Fabric Cutting (Fat Quarter Friendly)		
	1 Block	Runner
Border FQ	1 strip @ 1-1/2"	4 strips @ 1-1/2"
Corner Squares (background)	1 strip @ 2-1/2"	2 strips @ 2-1/2"
FG Goose. (background)	1 strip @ 5 3/8"	2 strips @ 5 3/8"
FG Sky (star points)	1 strip @ 3"	2-3 strips @ 3"
Center Square	1 square @ 4-1/2"	1 strip @ 4-1/2"
Outside border		3 WOF strips @ 2" or 6 strips @ 2" from FQ
Binding		3 WOF @ 2 1/2"
Backing		15" x 40"



Block Pieces		
	Block	Tablerunner
Border 1	cut 1 @ 1-1/2" X 8-1/2"	cut 4 @ 1-1/2" X 8-1/2"
Border 2	cut 1 @ 1-1/2" X 9-1/2"	cut 4 @ 1-1/2" X 9-1/2"
Corner squares	cut 4 @ 2-1/2" square	cut 16 @ 2-1/2" square
4 at a time FG Goose	cut 1 @ 5 3/8" square	cut 4 @ 5 3/8" square
4 at a time FG Sky	cut 4 @ 3" square	cut 16 @ 3" square
Center Square	cut 1 @ 4-1/2" square	cut 4 @ 4-1/2" square
Outside border		

1. Make the four-at-a-time flying geese units following these [instructions](https://quiltingjetgirl.com/2022/09/30/updated-four-at-a-time-flying-geese-tutorial-and-sizing-tables/). Make 16 flying geese units.

2. Add a flying geese unit to top and bottom of 4 center squares.
3. Add a corner square to each side of the (8) flying geese units.
4. Add these units to the sides of the squares
5. Before adding borders, decide if how you want your stars to face in the table runner. You may have a directional print to consider.
6. Add the short border.
7. Add the long border.
